

Report on Activities March 2021 – April 2022

Covid Response Project

- Delivery of healthy, high quality produce to organisations across Glasgow who were working on the 'frontline' - providing food and other neccessitites to people and families in need.
- Reached over 30 organisations and hundred of people needing emergency food.
- Worked in partnership with Glasgow University, The Space, FareShare, Glasgow Community Transport, GreenCity Wholefoods.





Covid Response Project

- 5 Community Response Officers placed with host organisations: Govanhill Community Development Trust, Partick Thistle Development Trust, Empowering Women for Change, Glasgow Eco Trust and Cranhill Development Trust.
- Researching and facilitating hyper local food networks and projects that supported community development.
- 'Glasgow, Tackling Poverty With a City Plan' report published in December 2021 with recommendations.

- The core themes of this project being Food Education, Urban Agriculture, Community Participation and COP26.
- Food Education activities such as Climate Cafes, giving people a safe space to explore common issues.



















COP26 and Urban Agriculture

- FCA team reached over 630 people through workshops and collaborating with 87 partner organisations
- Partnered with Sustain through their Fringe Farming project looking to change the policy landscape and increase urban and peri-urban farming.
- A project with Central and West Integration Network for BME Women on a agroecological learning journey.





Glasgow City Food Plan

- 2 years of collaborative work culminated in launch June 2021:
 6 themes, 76 actions, 10 years and over 100 organisations involved.
- GCFN is the lead for Community Food and Urban Agriculture.
- We also host the Sustainable Food Partnership Coordinator post as part of our ongoing commitment to the Glasgow Food Policy Partnership.
